Definition of a Phase I vs. a Phase II School:

A Phase I school is a school, which is recommended to remain in a specific grade configuration at a specific site for an extended period of time, and for which there is little risk of engaging in capital projects and wasting the money due to future changes that would invalidate what was done.

A Phase II school is a school for which capital investment is not recommended until certain decisions are made as to future use.

A Phase I, Phase II school is a school, which is recommended to remain at a specific site for an extended period of time but the grade configuration is unclear. Certain capital projects can be initiated pending a final decision on grade configuration.

The overall goal is to provide equity at each grade configuration level based on the model school guidelines.
